
# 2.2 DEMOCRATIC REPUBLIC OF CONGO (FORMERLY ZAIRE): THE LAND OF DENSE FORESTS












### Journey to the DRC by ship from Mumbai






\* The capital is Kinshasa.

\* They are divided into several tribes and most of them belong to Bantu tribe.




\* Many groups of Pygmies are there in deep forests Known as Mbuti or Bambuti.

- Banana is also an important food crop.




#### MINERALS:-
